INCREDIBLE STORY OF PETER aka PITA

This is a story of LOVE, PATIENCE & ENDURANCE.

PETER, aka PITA, spent four long years in a shelter before our rescue in August 2022. Thanks to Shawna and Jay, he went to their loving foster home right after. Unfortunately, he needed to be returned after a few weeks due to an incident where he attacked the resident dogs (despite being described as fine with other dogs).

Years of shelter confinement likely left Peter unsocialized. He was reactive to both humans and dogs on the street. After three desperate appeals, Linda stepped up and offered her home to foster Peter. It wasn't easy—his behavior proved to be a great challenge. However, through Linda's love, dedication, and the training sessions provided by PARS, Peter began to show gradual improvement. Just when things seemed to be moving in the right direction, fate intervened.

Six months into fostering Peter, Linda was struck by a car in April 2023, sustaining severe injuries, including skull fractures, a brain bleed, and eye misalignment. She was hospitalized for two months, unable to drive or keep her job. As Linda had been Peter's primary caretaker, her injury disrupted the training plans she had in mind. Thankfully, her husband Gord stepped in and took over Peter's care, and they grew close to each other.

Linda's recovery has been a slow journey. After two eye surgeries (with another scheduled in May), she still struggles with balance, often feeling dizzy, but remains determined to regain her independence - She is hoping to get back the licence soon. A year after the accident, in April 2024, Linda made a big decision, SHE OFFICIALLY ADOPTED PETER! Her resilience and determination are truly inspiring.

This is the power of LOVE, PATIENCE and ENDURANCE. Together, LINDA, GORD and PETER have overcome huge challenges and built an unbreakable bond. THANK YOU, LINDA & GORD!

It only been pretty recent that I can walk further than around the block. Stamina has been the slowest to come back. He's an incredible dog. So loving, and anxious to please. He is still is very reactive to big dogs, small ones are hit and miss. He is wary of all strangers and sounds as though he wants to eat them until he gets to know them. His episodes are much shorter now, thankfully, we work on it daily. Once a month we take him for a 2.5km trail walk now that I'm able. We meet a friend and her dog; Peter now has a friend yay! I do muzzle him when we have the possibility of running into others. He has learned to play with a treat ball, which he loves. He doesn't play with anything else. We sit outside on front porch every morning regardless of the weather. He loves just watching the neighborhood (as long as nobody comes near the house) lol. He needs more socializing with both people and dogs which we can finally start doing more and more. PETER deserves to have everyone see what we see, the sweetest most gentle pup ever. We love PETER to bits and enjoy him daily. He is so kind and gentle with us and my mother. Thank you so much for bringing our family together."
